HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

Foundations for Disciples is the first step in discipling new believers.

The purpose of *Foundations* is to give disciple-makers a tool for starting short-term discipling with a new or undeveloped believer. These twelve sessions will establish believers in their identity as followers of Jesus, teach them to obey Jesus, and lead them into active participation in the fellowship of a local church.

Foundations trains new believers to be disciple-makers from the start. The oikos map, 15-second testimony, and 3-Circles are practical evangelism tools reinforced throughout the study.

If you are unfamiliar with how to lead a small discipling group, viewing the Church Circle video will be enlightening. It is a good model for how to lead a group meeting.

Foundations lays the groundwork for beginning long-term discipling. Meetings 11 and 12 make this transition.

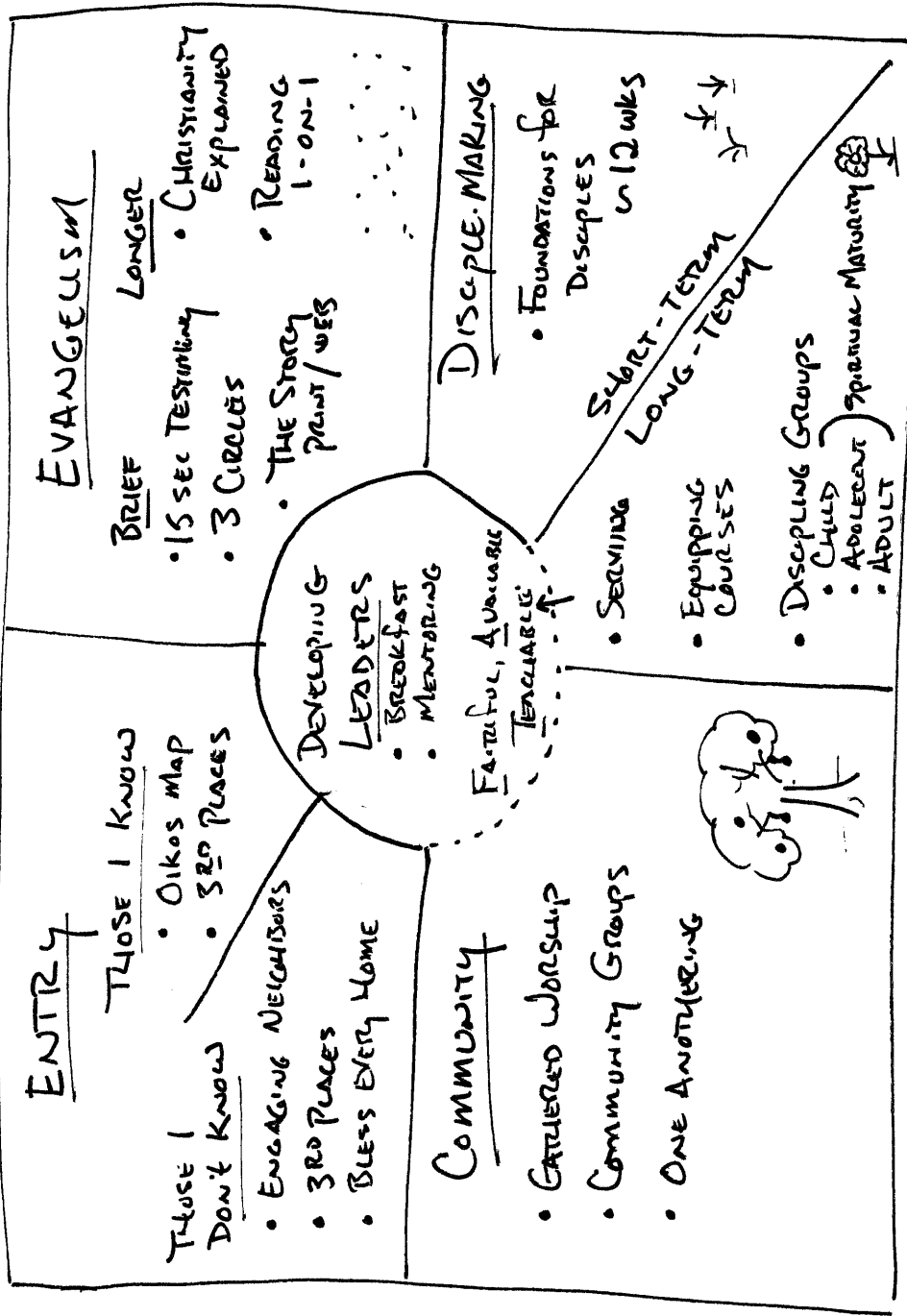
Additional Resources:

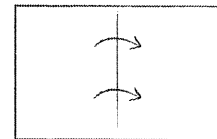

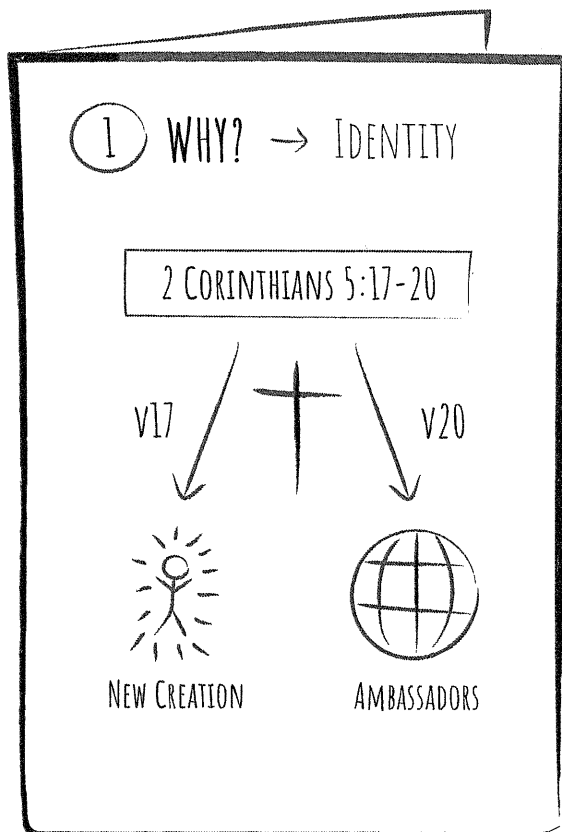

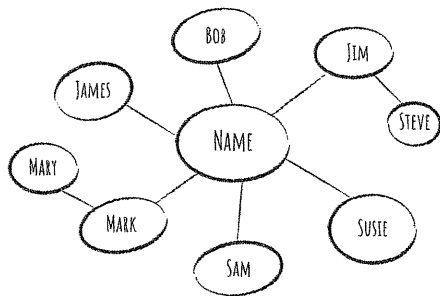
→ **Cross:** We see in these verses that if you are in Christ Jesus, these two things are true of you because of Jesus:

→ **v17 (person)** - You have been made NEW! He has forgiven all your sins.

→ **v20 (globe)** - He has given you a new identity as His ambassador.

You cannot separate these two. You cannot become new without being an ambassador of Jesus and you cannot be an ambassador of Jesus without being made new.

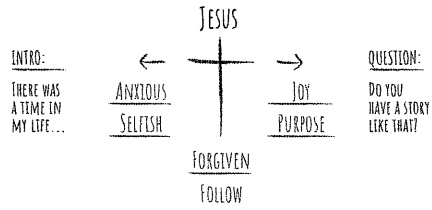

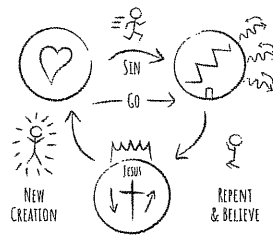
→ "Oikos Map": map out relationships of people in your life who are far from God.

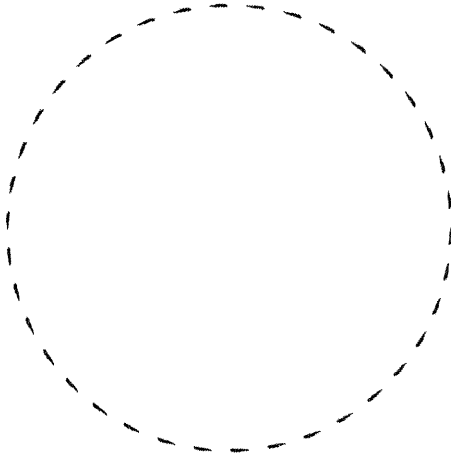

THE CHURCH CIRCLE

1. Draw a dashed circle. This dashed circle represents a gathering of believers.



2. These symbols represent the basic functions of a healthy disciple and church we see in Acts 2:36-47. Some of these functions have already been studied in the lessons, others have simply been practiced week to week without studying a specific lesson on a function (ex. God's Word, Worship).

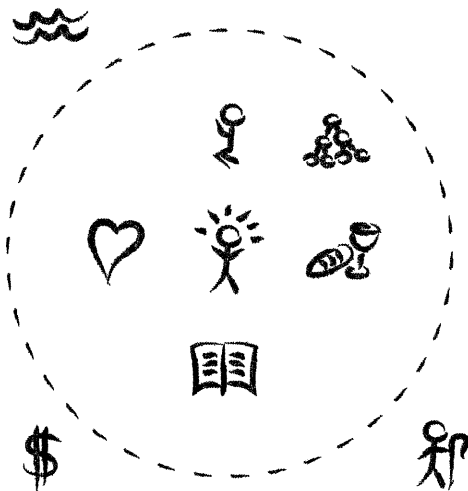

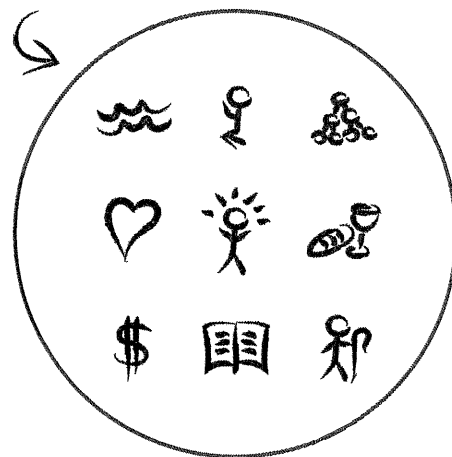
The arrow represents Jesus' command to **Repent & Believe**. Most draw it outside the circle because this is how one begins a growing relationship with Jesus & is biblically part of His Church.

3. Draw each of the functions which your gathering is consistently practicing inside the circle. Draw the functions which your gathering has not yet practiced outside the circle.



In this example above, the gathering has practiced some very important functions of a church. However, there are a few functions that have yet to be practiced. If your church has yet to practice all the functions, make an action plan to begin practicing them today.

4. If a gathering has identified itself as a "church", then you may make the dashed line solid. The goal is to have a church become healthy and practicing all the functions as modeled by the New Testament Church in Acts 2:36-47.

This chart will help you understand how the Old Testament promised the Savior, where Jesus and the mission of the church fit into history, and how all God's promises will be fulfilled in the New Creation. (Teach through the Storyline chart and have learners copy it as you teach.)
 4. Who can you teach the *Storyline* to this week?

Practice: 15-second testimony

Developing Disciples: Begin Long-Term Discipling

- Care:** How are you doing?

1. Read 2 Timothy 2:1-2. What did Paul instruct Timothy to do? How might Timothy carry out this task? How many generations of learners are in view?
 2. This is our last session in *Foundations for Disciples*. At this point you will transition into a long-term discipling group. This group will be based on these daily exercises: *Reading the Bible, Journaling, and Praying*. (Review the next page teaching how these are done).
 3. Identify which reading plan to start with this week (Gospel/Epistles for new believers).
 4. Identify the leader and group that will form for the next 12-24 months.

Practice: Update your oikos map

Set Goals: Fish: Who will you share with this week?

Commission: Pray and ask God for his power to help you obey these goals.

INSTRUCTIONS: DAILY READING AND JOURNALING

- Studying the Bible, coupled with prayer, is the single most important daily habit to develop for spiritual growth.
- It helps to have a consistent time, location, and pattern for daily reading, journaling, and prayer.
- Follow the daily reading track assigned by your group leader. Add additional tracks as you'd like.

New Believers → Gospel + Epistles Track

1. **READ:** Slowly read the passage. Re-read a second time as needed. If something is unclear, consult Study Bible notes.

ESV Study Bible, published by Crossway, is an excellent resource.

2. **JOURNAL:** Write answers to the following SPECK questions:
 - Is there a **sin** to forsake?
 - Is there a **Promise** to believe?
 - Is there an **Example** to follow?
 - Is there a **Command** to obey?
 - What **Knowledge** about God is learned?

If you have unanswered questions, write them down so you can ask them in the group meeting this week.

3. **Pray:** Use the reading and insights as fuel for prayer. The ACTS prayer outline may be helpful:
 - **Adore** the Lord
 - **Confess** sin
 - Give **Thanks**

4. **Prepare:** Come prepared for your weekly discipling group. Bring your journal and be ready to share with the group highlights and questions from your week's reading.

SAMPLE JOURNAL ENTRY

Date: March 9
Passage: Exodus 14

Summary: The crossing of the Red Sea

S: The people grumbled with Moses, "are there no graves in Egypt?" (v. 11). Grumbling against God and godly leadership is a sin I need to be aware of and resist.

P: Moses gives a promise to the people (v. 13-14). Fear not, stand firm, the Lord will fight for you. These same promises are repeated throughout the Bible. I can trust the Lord, no matter what.

E: Moses remains obedient to the Lord, though Pharaoh's army is threatening, and Israel is grumbling. This is a good example for me when I experience similar fears and hostility.

C: Moses gave instructions to Israel for them to follow (v. 13-14). I, too, must obey God's instructions to glorify and abide in him.

K: The Lord miraculously parts the sea. What a marvelous display of his power. He can be trusted to deliver his people to safety.

Questions for the group:

- Why did Pharaoh harden his heart, and what should I learn from this?
- This is one of the most famous miracles of God. Why does the Bible look back to this event so often?
